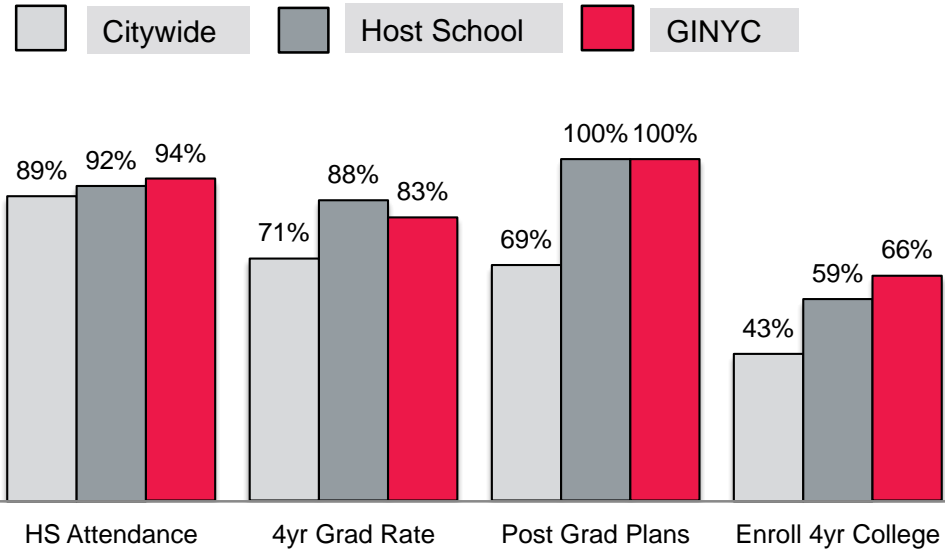

NYC Metro Area 60%	Outside of Metro Area but in NYS 25%	Outside NYS 15%
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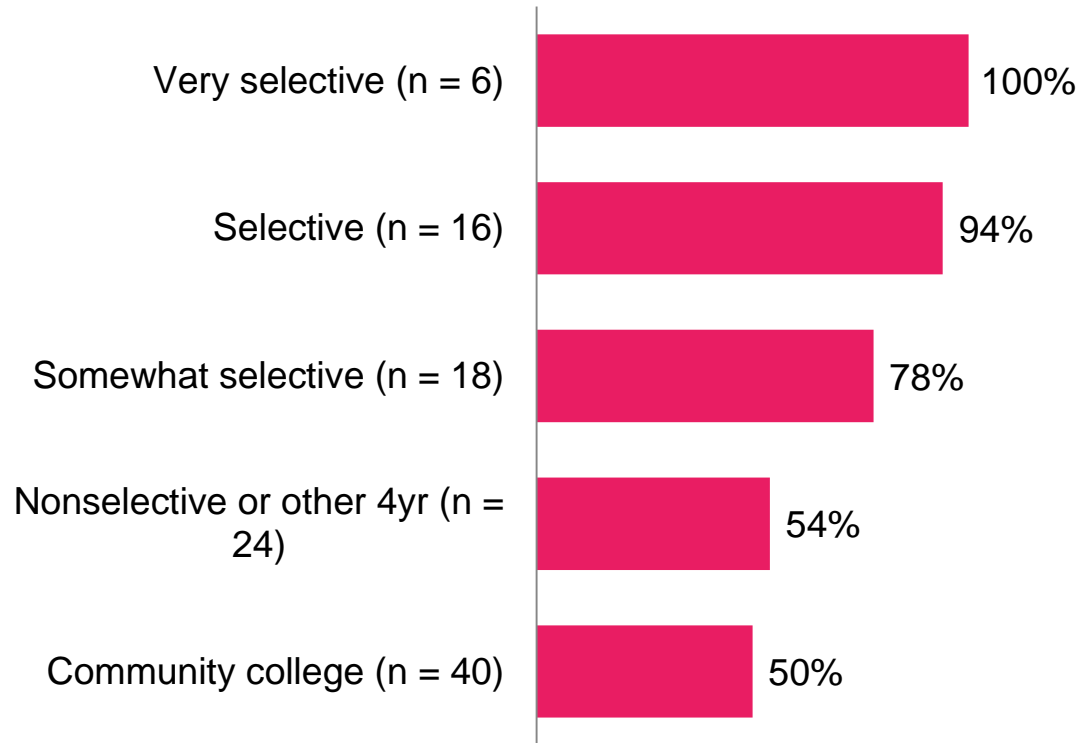


Outside Metro Area by Selectivity (N = 86)
